# BALTIC BRAIDS



### THE BASICS:

Knitted braids are made up of 2-3 rows worked over an even number of stitches.

Braids are mostly worked on items knitted in the round.

Floats (when yarn is carried across 1+ stitches) are created on the right side and are twisted to create the look of a braid and the direction that it leans or points in.

The manner in which the float yarn is twisted (under or over) determines the direction.

UNDER followed by OVER - right leaning OVER followed by UNDER - left leaning

Knitted braids can be worked in 1 or more colours. Most commonly worked in two colours.

# TWISTED BRAID [ESTONIAN]

This braid is the foundation that all other braid styles are built from.

It can be created over 1-2 rows/ rounds depending on the look you want.

Rnd 1: With both yarns held to front throughout, purl alternating colours bringing the yarn to purl OVER the other colour.

Rnd 2: With both yarns held to front throughout, purl following the colour pattern established in rnd 1 bringing the yarn to purl **UNDER** the other colour.

# KIHNU VITS / KIHNU BRAID [ESTONIAN]

This braid is from the small Estonian island Kihnu.

These braids are often stacked with a knit row in the main / background colour between each braid.

It is created over 2 rows / rounds.

Rnd 1: knit alternating colours.

Rnd 2: With both yarns held to front throughout, purl in the opposite colour of the stitch bringing the yarn to purl OVER the other colour.

## LATVIAN BRAID [LATVIAN]

Very similar to the Estonian twisted braid. This braid is worked over 3 rows / rounds.

Rnd 1 (set up): knit alternating colours

#### **LEFT**

Rnd 2:With both yarns held to front throughout, purl in established colours from rnd 1 bringing the yarn to purl **OVER** the other colour.

Rnd 3: With both yarns held to front throughout, purl in established colours from previous rnds bringing the yarn to purl **UNDER** the other colour.

#### **RIGHT**

Rnd 2:With both yarns held to front throughout, purl in established colours from rnd 1 bringing the yarn to purl UNDER the other colour.

Rnd 3: With both yarns held to front throughout, purl in established colours from previous rnds bringing the yarn to purl OVER the other colour.

# **DIRECTIONS**

Using 4mm / US 6 needles with MC, CO 40 sts. Join in the rnd and PM for BOR.

Rnds 1-2: work 1x1 rib as follows: [k1, p1] repeat [-] to end.

Rnds 3 - 4: k to end.

Follow chart or written instructions.

WRITTEN

#### TWISTED BRAID

Rnd 1: Join CC. With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with MC bringing MC OVER CC, p1 with CC bringing CC OVER MC], repeat [-] to end.

Rnds 2 - 3: With MC only, k to end.

Rnd 4: repeat rnd 1.

Rnd 5: With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with MC bringing MC UNDER CC, p1 with CC bringing CC UNDER MC], repeat [-] to end.

Rnds 6 - 8: With MC only, k to end.

### KIHNU VITS / KIHNU BRAID

Rnd 9: [k1 with MC, k1 with CC], repeat [-] to end.

Rnd 10: With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with CC bringing CC OVER MC, p1 with MC bringing MC OVER CC], repeat [-] to end.

Rnds 11 - 13: With MC only, k to end.

### LATVIAN BRAID

Rnd 14 (set up): [k1 with MC, k1 with CC], repeat [-] to end.

#### **LEFT**

Rnd 15: With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with MC bringing MC OVER CC, p1 with CC bringing CC OVER MC], repeat [-] to end

Rnd 16: With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with MC bringing MC UNDER CC, p1 with CC bringing CC UNDER MC], repeat [-] to end

Rnds 17-19: with MC only, k to end.

**RIGHT** 

Rnd 20: repeat rnd 14

Rnd 21: With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with MC bringing MC UNDER CC, p1 with CC bringing CC UNDER MC], repeat [-] to end

Rnd 22: With both MC and CC held to front throughout, [p1 with MC bringing MC OVER CC, p1 with CC bringing CC OVER MC], repeat [-] to end. Break CC.

Rnds 23-24: with MC only, k to end.

Rnds 24-25: work 1x1 rib as follows: [k1, p1], repeat [-] to end.

BO in rib pattern.

### **ABBREVIATIONS**

BO - bind off

BOR - beginning of round

CC - contrast colour

CO - cast on

k - knit

MC - main colour

p - purl

PM - place marker

rnd(s) - round(s)

st(s) - stitch(es)

[-] - repeat everything between [ ]
